## Norber Erratics and Crummackdale

Meet at Buck Inn at 10am, to start walk from Clapham car park by 11:15am (at latest)

Use of Clapham Nat. Pk. car park is £4 per car – there may be free street parking.

A lovely 8 mile walk in fine limestone scenery, in the lovely Crummackdale landscape. Longish, but generally easy on unsurfaced green lanes and good tracks, with one or two short (though not hard) climbs. Starting from Clapham with a small climb to the Norber erratic field (Silurian boulders) and passing across a limestone pavement with fine views of Ingleborough and Penyghent, then back down along Long Lane to Clapham with long views towards Lancashire.

Bring your own coffee / picnic lunch. Cafes and the New Inn in Clapham will be available at the end of the walk.

Should take us about 4.5-5 hours. Dog owners note that, apart from one field, the route is cattle free, but a couple of steep ladder stiles.
