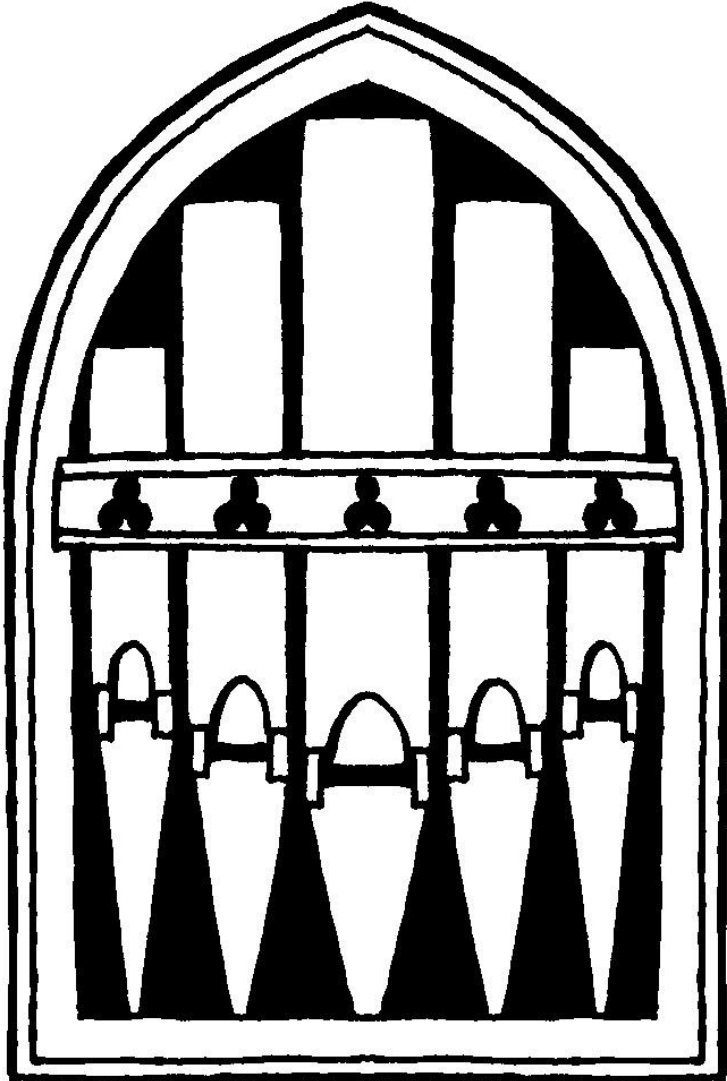

# From the Vicar...

## Music on a summer's evening

I recently heard the organ at the Royal Albert Hall played live on Radio 3 in the run up to this year's Proms. The organ is the size of a small country house. It has 9,999 pipes and is colloquially known as 'The voice of Jupiter'.

Richard Pearce was playing Widor's Toccata in D. I was transported back to the same piece played just as brilliantly last month by Matthew Atherton on the modest pipe organ at Arncliffe Church, a 'one manual' with 54 keys and 24 pedals. It is the only pipe organ remaining in the four historic churches of this parish.

According to Petroc Trelawney, a handful of people were present to hear the live concert at the Albert Hall. In contrast numbers at our concert quadrupled this, with one lady impressively travelling over from Kirkby Lonsdale for the occasion.

The Widor was the grand finale of a special recital by Matthew at Arncliffe. Matthew had been personally involved in the pedal board restoration project by the company Wood & Son. The programme included popular favourites like the *Dam Busters March*, and Louis Vierne's *Berceuse* which showed off the gentle reed sound beautifully. It was an imaginative and ambitious programme creating wonderful variations in tone and mood.

It was the first concert in the Church since the pandemic - a joyous occasion, creating intimacy and community on a warm summer's evening. We are grateful to Helen Parker for her great generosity in subsidising the cost of the restoration and to Matthew for travelling over from York to make our country church pipe organ sing.

Wishing you a summer full of relaxation and refreshment.

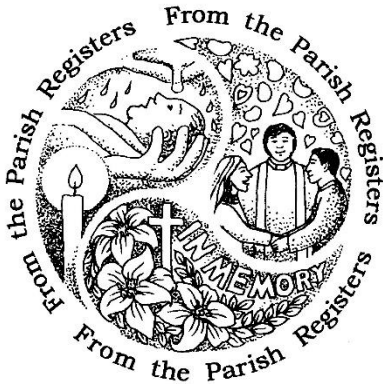

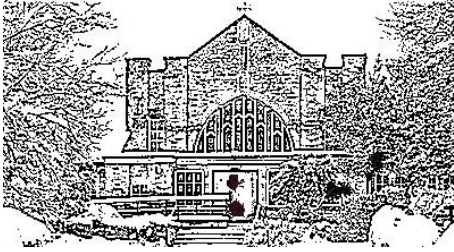
### *THE TRUSTEES OF CLEMENT ROEBUCK CHARITY*

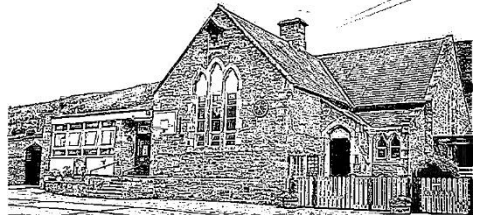

## Remembering Elsie Thompson, 12 Sep 1934 - 14 Apr 2024

**E**lsie was born at Armistead Farm, Litton where her parents Frank and Gertrude farmed, she had an elder brother Jack who later emigrated to Australia. She had a large family with lots of cousins (Metcalfes and Pullans).

Elsie went to Arncliffe Primary School and helped on the farm. When her dad died, she moved with her mum to Hellifield and got a job at Johnson & Johnsons at Gargrave.

In 1972 Elsie and her mum went to visit her brother Jack in Australia for 3 months, which was quite an adventure which Elsie recorded in her diary; I still have the koala bear she brought back for me.



The next year Elsie married Eric Thompson at St Oswald's Church, Arncliffe and moved to West Garth, Cracoe. My mother and I were both bridesmaids. Eric died in 2011 but Elsie remained at West Garth supported by neighbours until her illness and death.

From a young age Elsie loved music, dances and going to concerts my mother remembers listening to the top 20 on the radio and playing Dickie Valentine records. Eric loved keeping birds including a cockatiel that lived in the house, he also had



koi fish and kept an immaculate garden..We loved to visit as children and look at the birds and fish.

Elsie loved to socialise and had many friends in Cracoe meeting up for a regular weekly drink at the Devonshire. We shared the same birthday and would try to meet for a birthday meal and drinks. Elsie enjoyed meeting up with cousins at family events, having a drink or two and catching up on all the family news she was great at keeping in touch with far flung family.



She was a lovely kind and caring person who always had a smile, loved to laugh and was looking forward to the party she was going to throw for her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday.

## Sir David Attenborough's message in a Beresford song

**M**y wife and I often attend Evensong services at Hubberholme Church – it has been lovely to meet some of you there, in a place that means a great deal to our family. My father was Arthur Beresford of New House, a member of the musical Beresfords, and I'm happy to be one of the many members of that family to have inherited the musical genes.

I was a teacher and headteacher in North Yorkshire and Lancashire Primary Schools for forty years. I now concentrate my creative efforts into composing music for schools via [www.onemoretime.biz](http://www.onemoretime.biz) and have also written three books for children, published by i2i Publishing.

I want to help children to understand the climate crisis and the need for humans to take action to tackle the issue. It occurred to me that I could write and record a positive song and offer it as a gift to schools all over the world. I wanted to insist that no-one would make financial gain from the project. An ambitious target, and I doubted that I would be able to meet it: help was needed!

I wrote to Sir David Attenborough, asking if he would grant permission for me to take extracts from his speeches and set his message to music. I didn't expect a reply, but he wrote back within a few days. His handwritten letter came from his home address, and he was happy to let me proceed with the project!

I drafted a song, entitled '*This is the Moment*', directly using his message word-for-word and composed a setting of it for children's voices before working with a group of children from Whalley CE School, Lancashire, teaching them the song and its message. The song was recorded and made available via YouTube. It is found by

searching for *This is the Moment* (Life on Earth).

Sir David's name immediately attracts the attention of teachers worldwide. After contacting many Departments of Education across the world, a lot of co-operation has led to direct e-mailing by myself and via of those departments. In addition, the World Wide Fund for Nature and Natural Curriculum publicise the resource on their educational websites.

Since its launch in September, '*This is the Moment*' has now reached all schools in UK, every school in New Zealand and many in Australia, Barbados, Belize, Canada, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dubai, Gibraltar, Guyana, India, Ireland, Jamaica, Japan, Philippines, St Kitts & Nevis, Switzerland, Trinidad & Tobago and USA.

I have also written an extended version of the song for adult choir (soprano, alto, baritone, piano + alto solo). Sir David has permitted me to add additional words from his speeches. If you are a member of a choir or know of a choir which might sing the song, please contact me at [thisisthemoment2023@aol.com](mailto:thisisthemoment2023@aol.com). Again, there is no charge for the musical score.

## Country Diary – an August Midnight

A shaded lamp and a waving blind,  
And the beat of a clock from a distant floor:

**A**ugust: a month of fluttering and crawling insects; whole cities of them going about their business in the long grasses or sultry hot skies. I think this Hardy poem is so evocative in conjuring up warm summer nights, with those often-unwelcome creatures finding their way indoors and sharing our living space.

The other theme of August for me, and many other gardeners is weeds! Lots of them! No sooner have you toiled to remove the stubborn dandelion, thistle, dock and creeping buttercup between your carefully cultivated blooms than they're back, growing with alarming speed into a tangled



mess. The Anglo Saxons called the month of August 'weod-monath' (weed month) for this reason owing to it being the month when weeds grow at the fastest rate in the northern hemisphere.

As frustrating as it is, we know that many plants that we consider to be weeds have important medicinal properties.

Chamomile or Feverfew grows abundantly in my garden. It's a very pretty flower and is traditionally used as a remedy for headache or migraine. It is referred to as 'medieval aspirin' and is also reputed to have anti-inflammatory and anti-bacterial properties.

The ever present and persistent Dandelion, favourite food of my tortoise Nile, contains very high levels of antioxidants along with being able to aid in blood sugar management. The leaves, roots and flowers are edible and contain high levels of vitamins and minerals.

It may help to succour the blow of the repetitive toil of keeping these plants under control, with the August sun beating down, to think of them as rich in healing properties used by our forebears – and valued as a precious commodity.
