From the Vicar...

Jesus and the disciples have been together on the road. Jesus has just said that he is going to be handed over to death. He overhears the disciples arguing about who is the greatest. He stops in his tracks and says, "Right, let's sit down and discuss this".

He holds a child in front of him and he says, "Whenever you welcome one such as this you welcome me". The effect of doing this while seated is that you can't see Jesus without seeing the child. It is a total identification with the child. And it puts the argument the disciples have been having about who is the greatest into perspective: this is God bound to our smallness and vulnerability as human beings.

Last weekend we dropped off our older son off at a flat in Leeds. He is now independent after living at home for the last 21 years. Our younger son started out at university earlier this month. We are no longer the prime carers of children who have suddenly grown into independent young men.

In recent days Helen and I are both feeling a bit small. We continue to be parents, but our utility is much diminished. What are our lives for? We draw comfort from Jesus' valuing of the child. We have tried to care for our children and now we let them go.

We think of all starting out at university or living away from home for the first time. We pray for God's blessing on them, and for those who let them go.

Building On Our Heritage; Church Buildings Supervisor

WOULD you like to play a vital part in preserving our historic church buildings for future generations? The Parish of Upper Wharfedale and Littondale is seeking an enthusiastic and committed individual to take on an exciting new part-time role.

Our Church Buildings Supervisor will, in co-operation with volunteers, be entrusted with ensuring that work to conserve and repair our churches, work which has been identified and prioritised in reports by our Inspecting Architect, is carried out properly and in good time. To this end the successful applicant will be expected to establish good working relations with a pool of qualified local tradespeople and contractors, such as builders, joiners, plumbers and electricians, who can be called on to carry out whatever work has been highlighted by the architect.

The Church Buildings Supervisor will also liaise with and seek advice from key people at the churches, particularly those who have helped to look after the buildings, to take the greatest possible advantage of our rich

stock of relevant experience. This person will work under the overall supervision of our Parochial Church Council (PCC), with specific arrangements for their support, and for reporting their progress and recommendations for future action. Hours will vary depending on what tasks have been identified but we estimate it would be in the region of three days per month. The role will be on a self-employed basis.

There will be a scarecrow or two making their presence felt and a window display with a scarecrow theme. Tea/coffee etc will be provided for fortification and after the service on the Sunday. 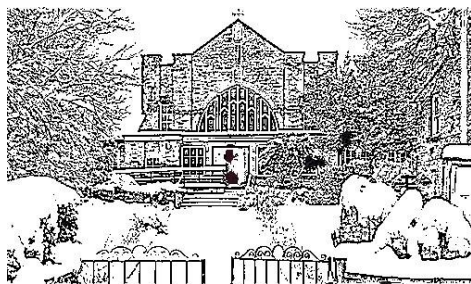
Time to Reap the Rewards!

Yorkshire Dales Rivers Trust

Open Day - 5 October

Yorkshire Dales Rivers Trust (YDRT) is opening its doors to the public on 5 October to offer an afternoon of river education. The drop in event which runs from 1pm – 4pm at Gilling West village hall near Richmond, comprises a full programme including a talk about the Trust's work and how it looks after the rivers Swale, Ure, Nidd, Ouse and Wharfe along with their catchments. There

will also be a guest speaker from Holmedale Nature Network and a film about the work of the community environmental group, Save Our Swale.

Additionally, the Trust's unique mobile classroom, branded Rivers2U, with its working rivers table and microscopes will be on site. This award-winning education project – which began in 2018, enables the charity to engage with and educate children and communities about everything to do with rivers, including understanding the geography of rivers, the water cycle, wildlife and habitats, how rivers work, flooding, sustainable drainage systems (SuDS) and natural flood management (NFM).

A (free) bookable guided walk along Gilling Beck with YDRT project manager Sarah Lonsdale and Professor Jonathan Grey from the Wild Trout Trust will also offer the chance to look at some of the issues being tackled by the Trust.

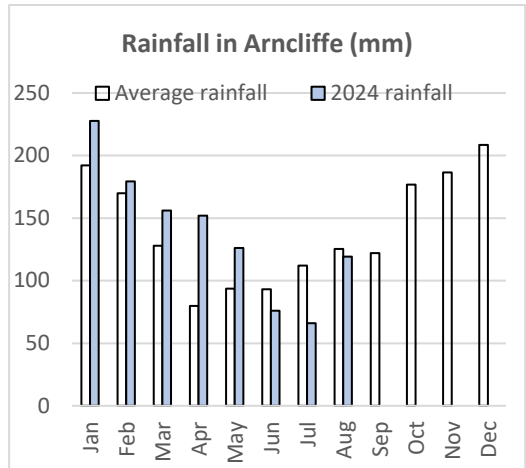

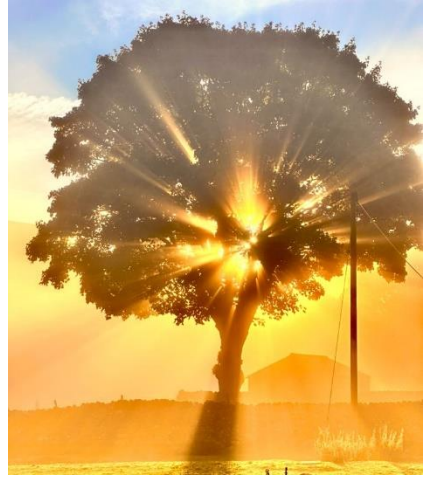

'October' by Louise Glück

As soon as October rolls around, and indeed for some weeks before, we are programmed to associate the month with spooky season, Hallowe'en, as supermarkets and shops become festooned with ghouls, ghosts and pumpkin lanterns.

As you would expect, the history and origins of this festival are anything but commercial and are rooted in challenges associated with the change of seasons, particularly in rural communities. Ronald Hutton, Professor of History at the University of Bristol, explains:

“Typically, this is the time of year when people in an ancient medieval community who have been away for the summer herding, fighting, trading or on pilgrimage would be returning to settle for the winter. Not dissimilar to today, even the best winters will provide dirt, isolation, claustrophobia, cold, dark, a lack of greenery and an immense potential for boredom and depression. Mocking the spirits of dark and cold and fear has always been part of these earliest Halloween festivities, one such tradition is the carving of faces in vegetables and the creation of glowing lanterns. Another aspect of Hallowe'en that we know, and love is the concept of trick-or-treating. Again, put



down to American tradition, the origins are actually a lot closer to home. It comes from the practice of the poorer members of the community going around the richer members or providing entertainment to obtain food and drink for their own feasting. The custom was taken from Ireland by mass Irish immigration to America in the 19th Century.”

It's interesting to think of our forebears finding ways to mock, or 'make light' of the coming dark months as they faced the potential famine, cold and illness that would inevitably accompany the winter months. Whilst our challenges are different, there is still a sense of trepidation as some people wrangle with a decline in their mental health as it becomes harder to get out and about, and we yearn for sun and birdsong. It's clear that the way to manage this is not through the quick fix of a new essential purchase sold to us by a persuasive post on social media, but through a gentler form of seasonal living that sees us take our wisdom, cues and knowledge from the nature that surrounds us and everything that it offers.
