WHAT TYPE OF ID WILL BE ACCEPTED?

We will accept either:

- one piece of photo ID such as passport, photo-driving licence, bus pass.
- two pieces of non-photo ID such as your poll card, utility bill, bank/building society/credit card statement, debit/credit card. Other forms of ID will also be accepted.

WHAT IF I AM UNABLE TO PROVIDE ANY OF THE DOCUMENTATION?

If you do not have any of the required ID, don't worry, you will be able to apply for a free 'Certificate of Identity' from Craven District Council.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T BRING ID TO THE POLLING STATION?

If you forget to bring your ID, you can leave the polling station and come back with it to vote. If you cannot provide the required ID you will not be able to vote.

DOES THIS VOTER ID TRIAL APPLY TO POSTAL VOTES?

No - postal voting arrangements will be unaffected by the trial for both existing postal voters and for those who apply for a postal vote for the 2 May elections between now and the postal vote application deadline on 15 April.
