
The entrance hall and common room offer a warm welcome to the incoming guest and are a centre of fun and fellowship.




On the first floor, with a glorious view of the Deer Park, is the drawing room—comfortable in summer and winter.







On the way to Ilkley is the ruin of Bolton Abbey.




Richmond Castle on the River Swale.
